There will be two sessions of concurrent workshop on special topics. Some of the topics will be of special interest to fellows and junior faculty, whereas others are tailored for leadership and experienced faculty. Some topics might be offered in both sessions if there is demand, while others will be only offered once.

session topic a) Skype Interview Do's and Don'ts and Mock Interview

The phone interview, and increasingly the Skype interview, is the next step when one's application makes it to the "long list" in a faculty search. Sign up for this session to learn about how to prepare for a successful Skype interview, and practice in a realistic mock skype interview, and get feedback for improvements.

session topic b) The Courtship and the Deal: Job Talk, Campus Interview, and Offer Negotiation

The faculty job search process can be mystifying. Come learn from the people who read the applications, conduct the interviews, make the hiring recommendations and negotiate the offer to learn about the structure of searches, and get tips on the process from compiling the application portfolio to the job offer negotiation.

session topic c) Creating and Managing a Professional Social Media Presence

Social media possibilities are ever-evolving. What are good options and strategies for fellows and faculty to build and maintain a strong professional social media presence? (Hint: Have you googled yourself?) This session will offer participants a place to learn, discuss, exchange ideas, and strategize.

session topic d) Faculty Mentoring and Diversity Strategic Priorities: What Do You Do in Your Institution?

In this round table for campus representatives and experienced faculty, we will share ideas about how different institutions structure their faculty mentoring programs. What resource and administrative commitments are needed? Does the college have diversity priorities beyond recruitment and tenure of diverse faculty? What are the next strategic steps?

session topic e) Post-Tenure Development: Renewing Professional Networks and Exploring Leadership Roles in Academia

For faculty post-tenure, this session examines professional development in the liberal arts. How does one develop new scholarly directions and recharge current interest? How to develop leadership competencies? And how might scholarly and leadership development lead to new professional opportunities within and beyond one's home institution? Explore these topics with fellow faculty and a professional headhunter.

Indicate that you are with the CFD/Consortium for Faculty Diversity and they will be able to verify that you are on the fellows list.

Depending on cost, you will either fly into Denver and take the Front Range Shuttle or fly into Colorado Springs and take a cab. The CFD will cover the ground transportation cost for fellows.

Arriving in and Departing from Denver

To make it in time for the Friday reception and dinner, we advise that you arrive in Denver in time to catch the 2:00pm or 4:00pm shuttle <https://frontrangeshuttle.com/schedules-and-prices>. Take into account the shuttle schedule when you book your return flight.

Reserve your ride with them at **719-237-2646**. Call ahead to reserve your seat on the shuttle and mention you are with the Colorado College CFD/Consortium for Faculty Diversity group, and they will be able to drop you off at the Embassy Suites or the Colorado College Campus. **You must reserve by phone and cannot use the online reservation** because the Embassy Suite and the college are special stops not listed online.

Fellows should indicate they are CFD fellows attending the conference, and the Front Range Shuttle will bill your ride to the CFD.

Take into account that the cab ride to campus and the Embassy Suites is approximately 30 minutes. Fellows will be reimbursed for their cab fares—please keep your receipts.
