Hunting ground is good intro to campus sexual assault
However, only one kind of sexual violence
Want to expand to other kinds and address all narratives after film

Many organizations already required to attend hunting ground

Greek life, sports teams, etc

President speaking at event

Important to put idea of leadership in anyone who goes to hunting ground screening

Idea of not being a bystander

Barbeque on Yampa with event themed around sexual assault topic

Would attract crowd out there

What are things we could do to engage people at event?

Require action to get food possibly

Even just answering a question about sexual safety

Make sure they know what resources are available to them

Webinar for off-campus people

Games and activities to teach about consent and other important issues

Group 2 Ideas:

Student made film

Video of relations play

Youth leaders presentation around language

What is acceptable when we speak about sexual language, medical language etc

Student had idea of sustainability with good intent

However, wording was problematic and ties into rape culture

Planning events, need to be careful about language

Using testimonials after being screened for anonymity

Confront people that may not go to these events

Thoughts around something relating to Playhard events

Area in Worner

Storyline with physical pieces attached to each

Encouraging people to think about it

Q: Have you thought about how to not cause problems for survivors who had been hurt?

A: Will make sure its done in a careful way that is provocative while being true

All things relating to implementation needs to be very thoughtful

Councilors must always be there to support people

Group 3 Ideas:

Ways of reaching other people

In less public ways

RAs have to do events

Coordinate with domestic violence center in the springs

Have education meetings with RAs and residents

More intimate setting than other more public events

Talking to ORC

Communicate with sports teams

Getting them to go to hunting ground

Work with Greek Life

Need to talk to people in non-triggering, safe settings

Ways to make hunting ground more effective

Giving out piece of paper and pencil to everyone

Have them write down any experience they'd had

Of any kind

Having a vigil post-film

Group 4 Ideas:

Short term

Making general information more available on the SARC website

More students need to know this

How do we take that outside and get info to students?

Potential conversation series starting maybe before hunting ground

Very impactful Lady Gaga video leading up to conversation
Providing list of questions to ask self and others relating to consent
Long term goals
Get college to rethink relationship to college for Penrose vs Memorial
Penrose refuses to provide plan B
Same distance, more resources at Memorial

Group 5 Ideas:

Active campaign

Evidence based programs that address sexual assault on campus
Engage with groups such as greek life and sports teams
Required discussion
Students of color to relate their experience with sexual assault

Passive campaign

Encourage motivation and momentum within active campaign
Educate what consent and sexual assault are

Group commentary:

Big things to focus on leading up to screening

Reach out to professors, coaches, etc to get more people at screening
Get people who wouldn't normally show up
Possibly free food for attendance
Possibly sponsor food for discussions around screening
Something engaging
Building momentum for the screening
Everyone join facebook event for the screening
Go yourself and encourage friends
Tell your group listserv
Encourage all professors to at least tell students
As long as every student knows about it
