Timelines and Deadlines For Summer Opportunities

SUMMER SESSION

- Apply for on-campus financial aid before Monday, Feb. 19
- · Apply for summer housing before May 1
- Apply for summer independent study courses through the Summer Session website. Wild Card and Summer Session financial aid cannot be used for an independent study course.

SUMMER RESEARCH

If you are interested in participating in research this summer, talk to your professors now and find out what research projects they are planning for the summer. Start planning early — deadlines for summer research vary by department, but many professors begin to identify and select their summer research students in January and early February.

Campus housing scholarship applications through the Office of the Dean will open after Spring Break. The stipend for a full 10 weeks of summer research is \$4,000.

CAREER CENTER

Internship Funding Awards: Open to all students returning for at least one semester in Fall 2018. Application materials will be posted on Summit in January, with applications accepted beginning February 19, 2018. The application will remain open until all funds are awarded.

COLLABORATIVE FOR COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT (CCE)

Davis Projects for Peace: The Davis Projects for Peace is a \$10,000 grant that supports students in implementing grassroots summer projects — anywhere in the world — that promote peace and address the root causes of conflict among parties. The proposal process occurs from Block 2-4 each year, with the final proposal due mid-December.

CC Student Farm Internships: Interns take responsibility for the CC Farm during the growing season and learn about sustainable agriculture through the practice of growing food. Applications are due on the second Friday of Block 5, February 22, 2018, and can be found on the CCE Summit site: www.coloradocollege.edu/offices/cce/.
