

Tashjian Crecelius Family Prize for Women in Science 2022

The Tashjian-Crecelius Family Prize for Women in Science was established in 2002 by Daniel N. Crecelius (Class of 1959) and his wife, Anahid Tashjian Crecelius, in honor of Anahid's mother Elize Tashjian and her deep commitment to women's educational opportunities and achievement.

The prize will be awarded to a woman student who is a major in one of the natural sciences, and who is student of color or international student. Preference will be given to Armenian or Armenian-American women. Awards of up to \$650 will be presented based on the best proposals in one of the following areas:

- To support a meaningful scientific research project in the natural sciences.
- To support travel expenses to attend a national or regional professional meeting, whether or not the student is presenting a research project or original research.
